FOR HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS

Adolescent Substance Use, Addiction, and Treatment: A TAG Talk: Video segments from youth.gov centered around how to effectively treat substance use disorders and address the stigma associated with substance use disorders.

Addressing Adolescent Substance Use: How to Recognize, Screen, and Communicate (1 CME): The ASAM e-Learning Center's curriculum that addresses adolescent substance use and disorders in general medical practice and covers topics such as the scope of the problem, screening and assessment, communication with patients, and more.

Adolescent SBIRT: Toolkit for Providers: Toolkit to assist providers with adolescent screening, brief intervention, and referral for treatment for alcohol and other drug use.

AHI Confidentiality Resources: Adolescent Health Initiative's webpage containing links to short trainings on confidentiality best practices, confidentiality laws by state, starter guides, and infographics.

AHI Confidential Risk Screening Starter Guide: Adolescent Health Initiative's 4-page PDF briefly describing the best practices and sample clinic workflows for confidential risk screening for adolescent patients.

American Academy of Pediatrics - Marijuana: Provides links to variety of informational resources on marijuana including policy, education, current news, and webinars.

BSTAD: (Brief Screener for Tobacco, Alcohol, and other Drugs) Assess substance use disorder in adolescents aged 12-17. Algorithmic tool with different interfaces available for a patient vs. a clinician.

The Cannabis/Marijuana Awareness & Prevention Toolkit: Stanford Medicine provides theory-based and evidence-informed resources that are focused on the prevention of cannabis/marijuana use in middle and high school students.

CRAFFT: (Car, Relax Alone, Forget, Friends, Trouble) Validated substance use screening tool for adolescents aged 12-21.

H.E.E.A.D.S.S.S.- A Psychosocial Interview for Adolescents: (Home environment, Education and employment, Eating, peer-related Activities, Drugs, Sexuality, Suicide/Depression, and Safety from injury and violence) Brief overview of a screening tool to assess risks in youth and provide potential assessment questions.

Identifying Risks and Improving Outcomes for Adolescent Patients: An infographic provided by the Adolescent Health Initiative that illustrates the importance of confidential risk screening.

Marijuana: Education and Youth Prevention Resources for Community Agencies: Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment's webpage with prevention and education resources around adolescent cannabis use for community organizations, educators, and health professionals.

Marijuana Use in Adolescent Populations: CDC's eLearning CME course that increases provider's knowledge of the usage, impact, and perceptions of adolescent cannabis use.

RAAPS: (Rapid Assessment for Adolescent Preventive Services) Standardized validated risk assessment of behaviors that impact adolescent health.

<u>S2BI:</u> (Screening to Brief Intervention) Substance use screening tool for adolescent patients aged 12-17. Algorithmic tool with different interfaces available for a patient vs. a clinician.

Sex, etc. Interactive map that provides comprehensive summaries of the health rights of minors, sponsored by Rutgers University.





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FOR YOUTH

Above The Influence: Website that provides stories of youth attitudes, ways for teens to be involved in spreading awareness of substance use, and tips to resist peer pressure.

SAMHSA's National Helpline: Free, confidential, 24/7, 365-day treatment and referral information for youth and their families facing mental and substance use disorders provided by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA).

Tips For Teens: Marijuana: SAMHSA's informational sheet provides teens with facts about cannabis and risks associated with substance use.

FOR PARENTS

How to Talk About Marijuana: The Partnership for Drug Free Kids offers parents suggestions on how to talk about marijuana use with their children and provides the Marijuana Talk Kit to assist with guiding the conversation.
